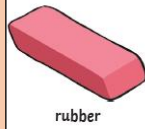


Once Upon a Time Key Fact Sheet - Science

There are lots of different types of materials such as wood, plastic, glass, fabric, cardboard, paper, brick, metal, water and rock.



Soft



Materials can be put in groups based on their physical properties, such as whether they are hard, soft, transparent, opaque, flexible or rigid.



Flexible

We can use our senses to help us verbally describe the properties of different materials.

Key Vocabulary

material	The matter from which things can be made.
properties	The features we can sense, measure or test.
rigid	Something which is unable to bend. It is not flexible.
flexible	Something which bends easily without breaking.
stiff	Something which is tricky to bend.
opaque	Something which you cannot see through. It is not transparent.
transparent	Something which you can see through.
absorbent	Something that soaks up liquid easily.
waterproof	Something which keeps out or off water.



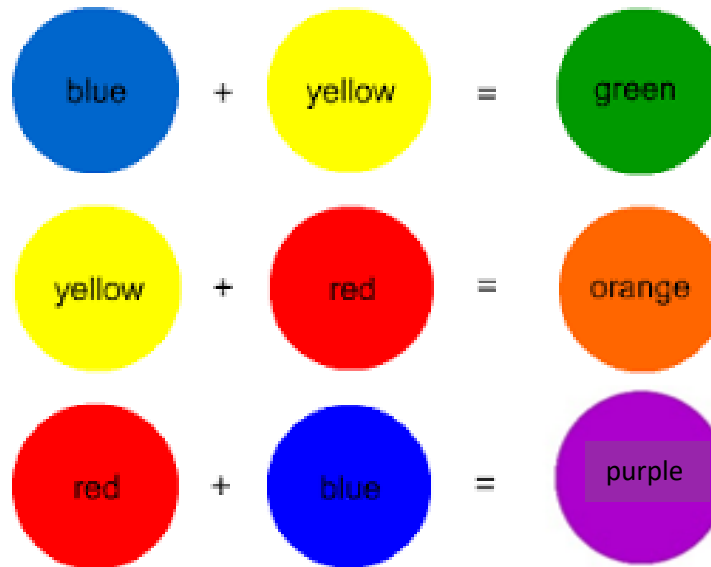
We can find answers to scientific questions through investigating.

Once Upon a Time Key Fact Sheet – Art and Design

There are 3 primary colours. A primary colour cannot be made by mixing other colours together. The primary colours are *red*, *yellow* and *blue*.



When two primary colours are mixed together they make a secondary colour. These are *green*, *orange* and *purple*.



Paul Klee is an artist who uses 2D (flat) shapes to make pictures.

Key Vocabulary

secondary colour	A colour made from mixing two primary colours.
fabric	A cloth-like material.
pastels	A material used to draw or create art.



Once Upon a Time Key Fact Sheet – Design Technology



There are lots of different ways to join materials together. We could use glue, string or tape. Some joining methods are stronger than others and we need to choose the best material for the job.

Key Vocabulary

<i>stiff</i>	<i>Something which is tricky to bend.</i>
<i>strong</i>	<i>Something which is able to withstand force or pressure.</i>
<i>stable</i>	<i>An object which is not likely to give way or fall down.</i>
<i>materials</i>	<i>The matter from which things can be made, e.g. wood, plastic, bricks, glass, fabric.</i>

We should use scissors safely to cut different materials. We must also remember to carry scissors safely with the blades facing down.



A design brief tells us what the design needs to have. For example, when building a castle, the design brief might say, must have a turret, a drawbridge and a moat.

Christianity

Key Question:

Does God want most Christians to look after the world?

A key Christian belief is that caring for the world that God created is important.



In the Bible, Christians can read about The Creation Story which describes how God created the world in 7 days. This helps many Christians to think about how their actions affect the world.



Key Vocabulary

Christianity	The name of a major world religion.
God	The name of who Christians believe created Earth and everything in it.
Christian Creation Story	The story of how the world was created, found in the Bible (Christian holy book).
believe	Thinking that an opinion is true.
kindness	Being friendly, generous, and considerate.
unkind	Not being friendly, generous, and considerate.
care	Looking after someone or something.
caretaker	A person responsible for looking after someone or something.
respect	Treating or thinking about people in a positive way.
friendship	Being a good friend to someone and showing this.

There are lots of ways we can all help to look after our world:

- We can treat people and animals with respect and kindness.
- We can recycle materials and put rubbish in the bin.
