Take care with sharp objects and use safely. Always wash hands before handling food.

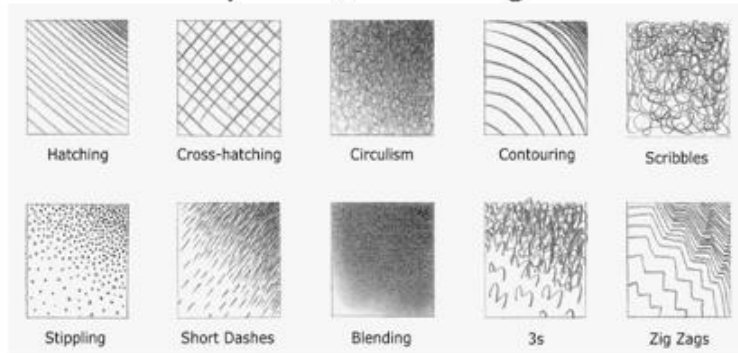


Key Vocabulary

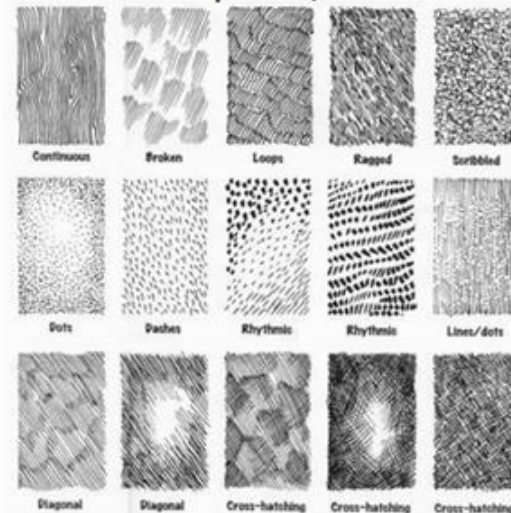

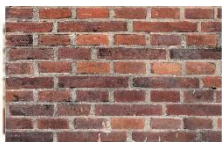

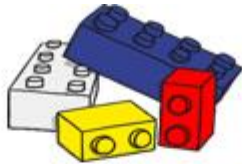


Dazzling Dahl Key Knowledge Fact Sheet - Science

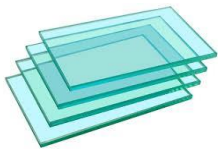
